JAIL BOND NEEDED

Pottawattamie County Sheriff, Jeff Danker, spoke to Club members about plans for the bond issue for a new jail facility to be submitted to voters on November 28. Jeff explained the current jail was constructed in 1977 with 43 cells, but twice this number are needed now. There are no expansion options for the current jail and transport to other jails is very costly. Furthermore, both the lowa State Fire Marshall and Jail Inspector have asked for improvements in order to continue the present jail operations. Jeff indicated the bond issue is needed to finance a new jail. Current plans call for a 275 cell facility with room for expansion to 375. A potential site on the north side of Council Bluffs is being investigated for construction of a new jail.
