A LITTLE EXTRA HELP AT SCHOOL

LaJean Wehring spoke to Club members about her teaching responsibilities at the Treynor schools. LaJean is in charge of the Title 1 program to assist elementary students with learning difficulties. LaJean indicated she gives students selected by other teachers individual attention on subjects which they need extra teaching. The additional teaching may include early introduction to certain subject topics, subject material drills, and review of topics taught. These extra minutes with some students can greatly aid their learning progress.

LaJean also teaches 8th grade Earth Science and 9th through 12th grades Health. LaJean said the Health unit covers topics of personality, stress, study skills, life cycle, diseases, relationships, and drug education.
