Angels Care Home Health Services

Sandy Howard, marketing representative for Angels Care Home Health presented the program on May 7 and discussed the various options for care including which is covered by Medicare and what is to be paid for privately. This depends on whether the services are for skilled services or caregiver services. Angels Care Home Health Services are available 7 days a week if needed.

Rehabilitation services include physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech therapists, a falls prevention program, and a light step program for increasing circulation and reducing pain in body extremities. Registered nurses (RNs) are responsible for initial patient assessment, developing a plan of care, and providing skilled instruction. LPN and LVNs provide direct patient care under the supervision of the RNs.

Neola Theater

Pete Sorenson from the Lions Club in Neola spoke about the Neola theater on May 14. The Lions Club works to prevent blindness, restore eyesight and improve eye care for hundreds of millions of people worldwide. Information about the Lions Club can be found at <http://www.lionsclubs.org>.

The theater in Neola was in operation from 1913 until 1960 as the Phoenix Theater. The Masons used the building after that. Last year the Lions Club and other groups in town teamed up to renovate the theater, at a cost of about \$200,000. Fundraising, along with a \$75,000 grant from Iowa West Foundation and other grants made the renovation a reality this year.

The Neola Phoenix Theater has an advanced digital projection system. High school business classes, along with volunteers, run the theater. Proceeds are used for FFA, 4-H, and Lions Club youth activities. The theater will hold 96 people.

The theater is used for movies and special events. The Senior Center has a dinner and a movie once a month. There is a ladies night out periodically. The Special Education children went once for a movie.

Shows are on Friday and Saturday nights at 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. and Sunday at 4:00 and 6:00. The current movie is available at www.neolaphoenix.org/movies. Prices are \$4 for adults and \$2 for children 12 and under. All concessions are \$1. The theater sells local candies and donated popcorn.
