The Pickle Barrel Market is expected to open in mid to late August. It will include a deli and meat department featuring Certified Angus Beef. It will also include a large selection of fresh vegetables and other things available in larger stores. The deli will provide fresh barbeque smoked outside along with catering and baking services.

The store will include Blockbuster video rentals, an ATM, and dry cleaning by Fashion Cleaners, and Treynor logo sports clothing.

The store will employ around 20 people, including managers over three departments. The store expects to open at 7:00 a.m. Monday through Friday and 10:00 a.m. Sunday, closing at 8:00 p.m. on weekdays and 7:00 p.m. on weekends.
