Travis Castle spoke at the Treynor Optimist Club on October 6 about the Treynor Vision Group. Travis works at an insurance agency in Bellevue, NE. His wife teaches 6th grade and they have three children.

The purpose of the Treynor Vision Group is to facilitate projects that bring people together.

Treynor Vision sent out 1000 surveys this

Spring and received 423 responses. They meet at 7:00 a.m. on Thursdays at the Treynor School. They are working on 2 year planning phases.

Treynor Vision has an option to buy 63 acres North of the Zion church cemetery. They are working with a commercial realtor on the land, have hired HGM from Council Bluffs to do the layout design, and Paul J. Strawhecker to work on a fundraising plan.

The overall plan is a 20 year plan. Phase 1 is to purchase the land for about \$600,000. Phase 2 will be to prepare the entire land area for about \$1,000,000. Phase 3 will be to build parking and the fields with one field for \$1.5M.

An important part of the plan is sustainability. The yearly estimate for operating is \$10,000. They expect to receive revenues from tournaments, leagues, and concessions.

Moving forward, there will be several phases to gain community support. The first phase will be a quiet phase, from October 15 until February 15 2013. They
