



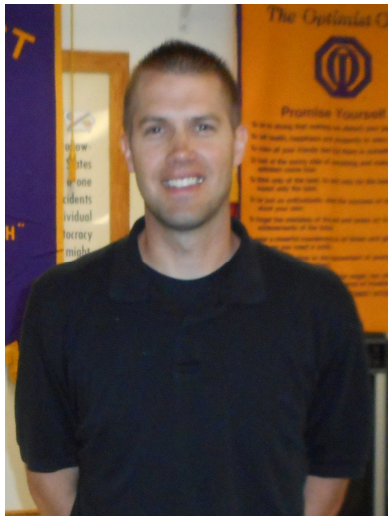

Impact for Youth

Jordan Campbell, Youth Pastor at Zion Congregational Church in Treynor and a 2001 Treynor graduate, spoke at the Treynor Optimist club on June 11. He discussed "Impact," the before-school care, after-school care and summer care children's ministry provided at Zion. The program began July 1, 2013 as an after-school care program with 12 full-time children and three part-time. Jordan has managed Impact from the inception; as he explained, "being invited to pastor a children's ministry had always been my desire."

Jordan has a Business Management/Entrepreneurship degree from Buena Vista University at Storm Lake,



Iowa. Managing a business comes with many challenges, but Impact has progressed at meeting those challenges and providing a needed community service.

The 2015-16 enrollments for after-school care have grown to 30 full-time and 13 part-time students. The before-school care has increased from

two full-time to eight full-time and 6 part-time to 9 part-time.

The summer care program has increased from five to 18 full-time and from 13 to 23 part-time students. Jordan also discussed Cardinal Core, where he is one of the leaders. Cardinal Core is developing ideas for youth needs and opportunities in the community. The Core's first projects are the swim lessons beginning June 20 and sponsoring the Treynor Days Food Fight.
