Gary Funkhouser introduced speaker, Kelly Groskurth, Treynor City Administrator/Manager. Kelly started off by showing a picture of the city's new logo and telling about the city's new website. The City Council and staff are working hard to bring Treynor into the 21st Century. Aging computers have been replaced and a server style network is in place. The city is preparing for the online billing process. A brochure explaining the online pay process was distributed.



The city with the assistance of Metro Area Planning Association (MAPA) has begun a comprehensive plan process which includes community meetings to discuss goals for the city. Areas of discussion are housing, transportation, economic development and recreation. The goals take into consideration Treynor's SWOT – strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats. The comprehensive plan guides how the city wants to look 20 years from now. There will be more community meetings to discuss the comprehensive plan.

The city has a water improvements project planned. The largest portion of the project is to replace the four inch water main along Highway 92. If all goes as planned, the water improvement project is scheduled to begin in 2017.

Discussion has begun on creating a recreational plan for the city. A recreational committee would

be formed of representatives from interested groups in the community. Kelly concluded with a preview of the new city website.
