Omaha Gun Club

Jeff Hoenshell, a certified instructor at the new Omaha Gun Club, was the speaker at the Treynor Optimist Club on May 6. Jeff said he is the oldest person at the gun club. He worked at Northwestern Bell for 20 years. He is an instructor and a community liaison.

The gun club was built in an old movie theater. They opened October 12, 2016 and will have their grand opening on May 19-21. They have 18 open lanes, twelve 25 yard ranges and six 50 yard. They also have 5 archery ranges. They also have a café for serving sandwiches.

Patrons can bring their own guns or use guns available at the club. There are some restrictions on ammunition that can be used.

In 2005 hurricane Katrina led to anarchy in Louisiana. This sparked a movement for more people to carry their own weapons;

Jeff talked about different types of handguns for people to carry. He said that a 22 long rifle is sufficient for most people. A 380 is a little big, but some people prefer it. The 9 mm is the most popular handgun and it is a little cheaper.

There are a lot of places where you cannot carry a handgun. They are illegal any place that gets 51% of its revenue from alcohol sales. They are also not legal on school property, at sporting

events, hospitals, voting places, rallies, and in Federal Ranger Stations, to name a few.
