Diane Forristall, Honey Bees



Diane Forristall, Macedonia, stated her dad (a bee keeper) convinced her to start keeping bees in 2004 when he moved from the farm to town. It was a steep learning curve, and she found you must manage the mites.

Mentoring from Dennis and Tina Murdock in 2016 helped her and she bought a nucleus colony and a Russian colony and expanded. She hasn't bought since. Managing 4 colonies is her sweet spot.

Diane brought along the frames and "supers" for us to view. The frames and "supers" are a combination of wood and plastic where the honey is made. Yesterday she pulled 26 frames stating it will be her biggest honey crop ever. Her goal was 100 lbs., but this year there will be 250 lbs. She sells at Prairie Crossing Winery and from her house and gives to her family. A pound costs \$12.

It is harvest time. Taking the honey off the frames is a process of waiting till they are fully capped and sealed over with wax by the bees. She then uses heated knifes to scrape it into a tub. An extractor uses centrifugal force to spin additional honey out of the frames. A hydrometer is used to measure the moisture. If it is too moist, a dehumidifier is used.

Diane dresses in either a bee suit or a shirt and veil when working with the bees. She likes to identify the queen bee by painting it. Sometimes she leaves two queens together to work it out between them. Bees gather the pollen in their back legs and back pockets. Once a month she studies each hive. She's been stung, but it doesn't affect her much. It was stated a honey bee can only sting once. A bumble bee can sting more often.

Honey bees are not native to the U.S. She said they fly anywhere up to three miles. Diane says she really doesn't see them. In their area, there are 14 acres of CRP pollinator seeding

mixture which is 80% flowers, 20% grass. A neighbor has sunflowers. She stated they could also be in the soybean fields. She said she hasn't lost bees due to spray. They have a vineyard with clover that they mow and spray. They use Sevin to control Japanese beetles. This year it's believed dragonflies are eating queen bees.

Testing for mites includes dusting 2T of powdered sugar on about ½ cup of worker bees. Flood them in water, and the mites will float off the bees. This number will show the extent of the mite problem.

Diane is married to Gary Forristall and is the mother of Hillary and Kevin. She also has grandchildren. She was the founding President of the Botna Valley Optimist Club. She has been a tax preparer for a number of years, but has retired from that except for a couple clients.

- Members discussed at length about the concern of how to handle cans in the can kennel in the near future. It is expected that the Glenwood Redemption Center will close. Beginning this past week, a helper is no longer being sent with the driver; however, the cans will be picked up next week and no final date has been announced.

Various other recycling plants were discussed with John and Gary providing information – Atlantic, Shenandoah, Glenwood (temporarily). John Klein is doing more research about Family Fare. In the future the recyclables will need to be hauled to the recycling center. Some recycling centers require cans to be sorted by brand. It is the desire of the Optimist Club to try to continue having the can kennel, but handling will need to change in some way.

One option discussed would be that the Optimists could continue helping with the sorting as in the past and bagging, but then the youth organization receiving the proceeds would need to transport (and sort by brand if required). They may be able to do the transporting within their organization.

Another option would be to see if we can find someone to hire to do the hauling and their expense would then be deducted from the total given to the organization.

Eight cents/can/bottle is received with 5 cents going to the youth organization and 3 cents going to the redemption center.

A motion was made by Gary Guttau, seconded by Chad Guttau to get bids for hauling cans/bottles on a regular basis to a recycling center in Atlantic, Glenwood, Shenandoah, or Family Fare (if they approve) and putting it in the minutes for the purpose of getting more information so a future decision can be made as to what option will work best. The vote carried.

This editor is requesting that all readers share this request with their friends and family that the Optimists are looking for someone to haul approximately fifty 50 gal. bags of cans plus boxed glass in a vehicle such as a horse trailer or large truck, etc. on
