



## Christ the King Presbyterian Church

Abel Sisco, minister for the Christ the King Presbyterian Church of Council Bluffs, spoke at the Treynor Optimist Club on October 31 about his church and their plans to build a new building in the future. They have been meeting at I.W.C.C. since December 2014.

Abel is 43 years old. He grew up Baptist. He was previously the minister at a small congregation in Ashland, NE. He moved to the area in May 2014 and heads a congregation of about 50 members.

The Presbyterian Church began with John Knox, a former Roman Catholic Priest from Scotland who studied with John Calvin in Geneva, took Calvin's teachings back to Scotland and led the Scottish Reformation of 1560. Abel said that in the 1920s the Presbyterian Church began to

change, with less emphasis on the Bible. Christ the King split in 1973 from the traditional Presbyterians and is more on the conservative side of the Presbyterians.

Christ the King would like to build a new church. They will launch their fundraising drive in March.
