Pastor Adam Magill of Zion Congregational Church in Treynor spoke at the Treynor Optimist Club on September 17. He was joined by Trevor Knudsen, Trey Quick, Craig Chapman and Payton Chapman. They talked about their experiences at Summer Games, a multi-denominational sports-oriented Christian camping experience in Covington, Georgia.

Pastor Adam considers the Games a discipleship camp with sports and an opportunity for youth to grow in their vocabulary for sharing the Gospel. The campers shared their experiences “the Crucifixion pageant increased my understanding ,” “closer to Jesus this year, two worship services a day,” “develop a closer relationship with cabin mates; pray with a friend,” and “closer to God and Jesus, super fun.”

Annika Vohs, a Treynor student with leukemia, was unable to attend the Games. The campers took a large as life picture called a Big Head of Annika to every worship service and all activities. Pictures were taken of Annika with the campers at the various events and then sent back to her to show the camp’s support. The entire camp of 300 prayed together for Annika.

The Treynor/Broadway Methodist group of 55 used a chartered bus, two mini vans and a suburban. Next year, two chartered buses are expected to transport campers the week of July 10-14.
