

New Treynor Restaurant

Boyd Blasi and his new wife Bev spoke at the Treynor Optimist Club meeting on April 26. The restaurant repairs have taken longer than expected. It is expected to open the end of May and will be called the B & B instead of the Rose.

The restaurant and bar will be separate. There are two new handicap accessible restrooms in both the bar and the restaurant. They also have new flooring, new paint inside (and outside soon), and a new bar area. The kitchen was totally gutted, with new floor, ceiling, and stoves.

The restaurant will be open mainly in the evening, 3:00 p.m. until about 10:00 Tuesday through Friday. It will be open all day Saturday and 10:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. on Sunday. It will be closed on Monday. They will have a small menu, light on steaks, with no fried chicken except for lunch on Sunday.

Three or four class reunions are already scheduled with others requested.

The bar and restaurant will have 20-25 employees. Six will work the bar side, with a waiter staff of about 8 and 6-8 in the kitchen.

Boyd owned pizza stores from 1986 until 2006. He was also the chief operating officer for a Bordeaux Pizza. He has also owned sandwich shops and a clubhouse restaurant, along with a bar and grill in Eagle Grove.

Boyd said that the Pickle Barrel Market is doing well. It has been open 2 ½ years. They are reorganizing the space. The meat, deli, and catering areas are growing.

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
