Emily McQueen Speaks




Emily McQueen, artist and wife and mother of five boys, shared her life's story and her art at the Treynor Optimist Club meeting on July 20, 2019.

Raised in Oregon, Emily enjoyed a normal childhood with four siblings, but there was one problem, she hated attending school. Her father, a VietNam vet, always taught her to seek her own path and to question authority. So in 8th grade, she proposed that she go to school just every other day. This was granted and her grades went up. In high school she did independent study, while taking math at school and participating in choir and music activities.

College was a different story – Emily absolutely loved it and said she had a permanent smile from day one. She always loved climbing trees and did this for fun daily. But then one day she was up 35 ft. and slipped. She was conscious the whole time and felt the slowing of time as she fell. She had a sincere spiritual thought that has carried her through: "You are going to be just fine and will have many opportunities because of this."

Emily had a 4 inch disparity in her spine and is confined to a wheelchair. The chair has changed her to the core, but it didn't really change her goals in life. After a year off of college, she did get her degree in elementary ed. and art, married, and now has five boys. She shared that she knows the extent of highs and lows and how they balance out and has a sincere gratitude for each day.



The group loved seeing her art, which is mostly water colors, and from a distance looks like photos. "Art is a reminder system of what is important – a selfish indulgence for an artist." Emily enjoys

painting antiques, nature scenes with beautiful skies,

and objects that have spiritual meaning and showed us many of her paintings.



The group enjoyed a good laugh when Emily said she is not raising her five boys as she was raised: "They have to go school and no, they can't take their birthday off!"


