Kara Huisman Speaks about Softball

Kara Huisman, Treynor Softball Coach, spoke to the Treynor Optimist Club on October 19, 2019. She was accompanied by her husband, Justin, who serves as the Assistant Treynor Softball Coach. They live in Treynor and have three children, Sydni, Jady and James.

Huisman stated they feel blessed to coach the great kids here and every day is fun. She feels the culture in Treynor is due to great parents.



Challenges with coaching softball are unique because there are three cross-over sports – softball, track, and soccer. There were only four days when she was able to have all of the players at one time. Rain was a major issue this season. They played games four days a week through June and then headed into conference

tournament and regional play in early July. Having a senior daughter and a team loaded with talent, it was a big relief to Huisman to win the regional final and the next two weeks became great fun. They “were smoked” in their first game at state, but beat Mt. Vernon in an extremely exciting game at Ft. Dodge.

This year Treynor had a softball sharing contract with Heartland Christian School which in turn put them into the 3A category. Bella Dingus was the only student from HCS to join them. They traveled to some far away schools and one of the favorite memories of the summer by the coach and players was the tournament played at Storm Lake, even though three games were played on the hottest day of the season.

Huisman shared her feelings about coaching her own child. Sydni Huisman received many awards and will be inducted next year into the Hall of Fame with 100 pitching wins. This summer she coached the All Star game with her daughter playing which was one of the highlights of summer. Huisman shared the annual booklet she prepares of memories after the season and stated the many, many awards players received.

There are two juniors who will return as seniors in '20. There were 28 freshmen girls out this past summer so they were able to have some freshman games as well as JV and Varsity games.

Interesting statements by Kara: “It takes 1000 swings to fix a bad habit in batting.” “The next five years will look different, but different is not always bad.” She is excited as it is like switching the guard. “When the culture is that you expect to win, you handle competition differently.”

Kara, a Glenwood native, graduated in '94 from Central College where she pitched and was named All American. She coached at a young age at Lewis Central and Plattsmouth, NE, went back to Central where she met Justin who was coaching basketball. Together they coached at Lynnville/Sully. She has given private pitching lessons since she was 19. It works well for the Huismans to work together as she needs an assistant 1) to maintain the fields which takes many hours, and 2) to tell her when she is wrong, to question, and push. Kara said Justin does that and is great with kids.

The Pott Co. Shopping with a Sheriff program was announced and it was determined to pass the hat on Mon. night at the 35th Celebration.


It was indicated that Jim Clausen found a reasonable place to order Optimist coffee cups to present to speakers. This will be considered at a later date.
