SPY Youth and Pastor Meyer Speak

Pastor Chuck Meyer and three youth from St. Paul Lutheran Church youth (SPY), Treynor, Iowa, spoke about their summer mission trip on Saturday, November 23 to the Optimists. The three youth were Kaylee Dykes, Jacob Kaeys and Delaney Waterman. The group also received their can kennel check of \$1402.60 for youth mission expenses.

A group of fifteen, which included four adults, traveled to Columbia, South Carolina to work on three major projects. One group worked on Miss O'Detta's house by installing insulation under the house, which had been ruined during the hurricane. Wearing Tyvex suits, masks, and goggles, they worked for two days. The weather was hot and humid, but they were touched by Miss O'Detta's gratitude as well as her wonderful homemade sausage brats which she made for them. Miss O'Detta was also touched by the prayer cross the group left with her and the fact that teens from Iowa would come to help!

Another group helped with Oscar and his project. Oscar used to be homeless and was about to jump off a bridge when a policeman stopped him, took him to lunch and chatted with him. As a result, Oscar made a change in his life. He now conducts a worship service in a park for others who are without hope. The group thought Oscar was a cool guy and helped clean out five U-Hauls of items that needed cleaning and reorganizing. He also was amazed that Iowa kids would come help do this job in such hot 95 degree weather. By the way, Oscar has tried to contact that police officer to no avail to thank him— couldn't even find his badge number!

The third group helped Miss Potts serve lunch to a large homeless group and made sack lunches – 300 and assisted her in other ways. They also took a tour to learn about the programs offered. The homeless who shelter there must abide by strict rules.

The group toured one of the older missions in town – the Oliver Gospel Mission est. in 1888 for men only. Because the SPY group had a large contention of females, they weren't able to serve there because the Mission didn't want female distractions. Men are referred there or just stop by.

Each day the group started with a devotion and breakfast. After volunteering, they gathered to discuss, pray, and have large group worship. One day they participated in a very contemporary church service and the other a very traditional worship service. They also enjoyed time at Myrtle Beach. What a great experience for these youth to serve!

Their youth leader, Denise Wilson, was unable to attend the Optimist Club meeting, but she is the one who leads and organizes the trips. It was hinted that they may try to work at an Indian Mission in Oaks, OK next year.


Community News:
