RE-CAPP: MEETING, SATURDAY, JULY 7, 1984

PRESIDENT GENE GRELL: Started meeting with short session using slides portraying different Officers & Committee Chairmen doing their jobs. (You had to see it to appreciate it. Those present weren't sure how "sincere" our President was! However, the message came across loud and clear: WE ARE DOING WELL AS A NEW CLUB! HOWEVER: THERE ARE A NUMBER OF AREAS WHERE WE MUST SHIFT INTO A MORE EFFECTIVE "MODUS OPERANDI" IF WE HOPE TO ACHIEVE OUR TOTAL ROLE AS AN EFFECTIVE OPTIMIST CLUB!!)

Vice President, Les Harvey introduced Committee Chairpersons: Lou Haack, Membership; Arlo Dunbar, Programs; Rick Saar, Finance; and Howard Knox, Fellowship. Each reported!

LOU HAACK: Membership Committee has not met as a group. Basic functions are being taken care of. We have (as of July 7) three new members. Plans are to have committee meetings and push for increased membership in addition to maintaining present level. Les Harvey commented that at a Zone Meeting recently, District Governor Caddell stressed the need to build memberships. Strong & Continuing membership allows a club to have funds to do things and it assures wide support in the community.

ARLO DUNBAR: Program Committee met once as a group; programs were set up through July 14. (The high quality programs thus far attest to their work.) A second meeting is planned for Monday, July 9 to plan meetings for the remainder of the year! (NOTE: The meeting was held with 50% attendance.) IF YOU CAN SUGGEST PROGRAMS YOU KNOW WILL BE GOOD, PASS THE WORD TO ARLO!!

RICK SAAR: Finance Committee has not met as a group. Three meetings were scheduled and then canceled. Rick reported that in the work of Optimist International, the finance committee is critical to the overall operation of the CLUB! The finance committee is to plan and develop fund raising activities to assure financing of projects. When such projects are planned, a special committee is set up to implement each project!

HOWARD KNOX: Fellowship Committee has not met as a group! Basic functions are being performed. There is some possibility of a "potluck picnic" with spouse and family in the city park yet this summer or fall. A possible visit of our club members to a meeting of another club was mentioned.

Vice President: Rich Morton introduced Committee Chairpersons: Norm Collins, Community Activities; Randy Donahue, Youth; and Walt Glade, Co-chair of Publicity. Each reported!

NORM COLLINS: Committee has met. Some probable activities (briefly): Assure correlation of Optimist Activities with those of other groups in the community; cooperate with the 4 CORNERS COMMITTEE to plan and carry out a MAIN EVENT for the afternoon program of this celebration. (One Possibility: A TUG OF WAR CONTEST--Local or Competition); assist in building a fence in the east ball park along road to protect youth from automobiles during play; provide an etching device and service to help citizens of Treynor mark identification numbers on their personal property; provide photographic equipment and service to citizens so they can set up an inventory of personal property documenting it with photographs; (for insurance purposes, etc.) Mention was made of possibility of generating some revenue from this service.

RANDY DONAHUE: Committee has met with 50% attendance. Possible activity once they get into projects: bike safety program; mo-ped safety program; oratorical contest; essay contest; "youth-in-government"--students "shadow" public officials for part of a day; assist in Jr. Golf Program in Treynor; promote and run a junior olympics in track & field; operate a Tri-Star Program in one or more of football, basketball, baseball, soccer; sponsor or help in the wrestling program; run an "Easter-Egg Hunt." NOTE: Scott Hill has been added to the YOUTH COMMITTEE.

WALT GLADE: Publicity Committee has met two times. The calling committee for meetings has been functioning (NEEDS REJUVENATION); Optimist International signs are planned for the entrances to Treynor; a letter introducing the Optimist Club to newcomers in Treynor will be handed out with the TREYNOR PRIDE BASKET PROGRAM.

PRESIDENT GENE ANNOUNCED THE FOLLOWING GOALS FOR THE FIRST YEAR: 1. One new member per month at least; 2. One community program per month; 3. One youth program per month; 4. Continue the excellent level of programs; 5. Have 4 social events in the year; One FUND RAISER per each quarter.
