The twenty members who attended the meeting listened to Randy Donahue, Chairman of the Youth Committee discuss short and long term plans for the Committee.

Therefore the YOUTH COMMITTEE represents one of our major thrusts. Two of the more pressing projects requiring prompt action which Randy covered:

A. Safety for children to and from school.

1. Homes will be identified in Treynor in every block where a person will be at home at a time during the day when children will be out and active.
2. Persons in these homes will agree to be especially watchful of the children as they pass through that block.
3. Each home so identified will have an identifying symbol in a window easily seen from the sidewalk or street.
4. The school will make certain all children know what the symbol is and that a person in that home can offer assistance in a time of need.
5. Any child who has a problem; has become frightened; or who needs help in any form can feel at ease in going to the house with the symbol displayed and can expect assistance in the concern at hand.
6. Persons in the identified homes will be especially watchful for circumstances which could be of concern. (Strange cars or persons, accidents, etc.)

B. TRI STAR SPORTS PROGRAMS.

1. Optimists International has programs for youth to participate in to assess their overall ability in each sports program. Our YOUTH COMMITTEE will run a TRI STAR PROGRAM in each major sport.
2. The first one will be in football where each child will participate in the PUNT-PASS-KICK events. Details on where and when will be announced. THE COMMITTEE WILL NEED YOUR ASSISTANCE. Volunteer your assistance to Randy!
