IOWA WESTERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE NEEDS MORE CLASS ROOMS

TOM JOHNSON, Treasurer and Facilities Management Officer for IWCC, spoke to other Club members about the bond issue proposed

by IWCC. Tom said the college wants to build a new building adjoining current buildings which will contain 15 class rooms. The class room space is critical for the education of IWCC students. Currently there are about 4700 credit-earning students and almost ten times as many continuing education program participants. Tom stated the student enrollment is expected to increase in the near future then be more static. Without this expansion some educational programs may be trimmed from the college curriculum. Tom noted the last building construction on the campus was in 1982, and student enrollment has nearly doubled since then. The bond issue, which will be before the voters of Pottawattamie and six other southwest Iowa counties on September 10, will allow for \$3 million in bonds to finance the construction of a 25,000 square foot building. According to Tom, the bonds will be paid in only ten years, which will save considerable interest cost. Tom encouraged everyone to discuss the bond issue with friends and neighbors. There will be more publicity as the election date approaches. A sixty percent yes vote is needed to pass the bond issue.
