Pres. GARY announced the 25th annual Iowa Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership seminar for high school sophomores is scheduled June 13-15, 2003 at Graceland College. He asked the Club to consider sponsorship of a student from Treynor.

Pres. GARY reminded everyone of the special Christmas breakfast meeting next Saturday. Guests are welcome. There will be a gift exchange during a recitation of 'The Night Before Christmas' among those who bring a gift of about \$5 value. New member inductions are also planned along with an interesting program.

Dr. WARD CHAMBERS serves as Campus Executive Director for Community and Multicultural Affairs at the College of Medicine, University of Nebraska Medical Center, Omaha. In October he visited Afghanistan as part of a US AID program to assist with the health information systems development there. He visited the medical school in Kabul, lectured students, and provided medical services to patients. In Afghanistan, Dr. CHAMBERS, explained health care and the availability of hospitals, doctors, and nurses are extremely limited. The major proportion of medical services is concentrated in Kabul, but the main 1000 bed hospital is damaged by recent war battles and is not usable. Many rural areas do not have hospitals or doctors, only 1 doctor per 450,000 population. There is no welfare system provided by the state, and the care and tending of the wounded from a generation of warfare, particularly the many thousands maimed by the vast number of land mines still found in the country, is a major social problem. Afghanistan is about 4.5 times the size of Iowa, Dr. CHAMBERS, noted, with a population of about 22 million. There are about 2 million in Kabul. Many Afghans are returning since the end of recent civil wars, and much rebuilding is evident Dr. CHAMBERS stated. The wars that have gone on for many generations have been politically motivated by the geographic location of Afghanistan on ancient trade routes between the middle east and Asia and the control of Khyber Pass, a major gateway to the Indian Subcontinent. Dr. CHAMBERS noted that most Afghans like Americans and want to learn English. The warlords of rural sections of the country are present obstacles to peace and rebuilding of Afghanistan. Dr. CHAMBERS has created a Foundation to accept donations to send medical books to Afghanistan.
