SORTING OUT THE LEMUR RELATIVES

Jan Williamson works as a DNA Sequencer at the Henry Doorly There she is involved with a project at the Center for Conservation Research to study the genetics of lemurs to prevent their extinction. Jan explained she spent a month in the island country of Madagascar to obtain DNA samples from many of the numerous species of lemurs found only in this part of the In this country with population pressure and serious deforestation, Jan noted, the future survival of lemurs is threatened. Madagascar is an interesting tropical area isolated from the African continent that has unique animal life evolution. The lemur is a primate that is lower on the evolutionary scale and less intelligent than the monkey. Jan explained lemurs are docile animals that are most active at night and sleep during the day. It is never quiet at night in the jungle, Jan noted. Jan said there are over fifty species of lemurs in Madagascar, so sorting out the genetic relations between species s a large task. She has over 1000 DNA samples to correlate at present. By relating the species to the environment in which they are found, the major risks and factors for their survival will be understood and hopefully their extinction will be prevented. Jan has worked five years at the zoo, which is involved with about 80 other projects concerned with animal conservation around the world. Jan noted that Henry Doorly is one of the best zoo facilities in the world to study DNA sequencing.
