MAKING ROOM FOR MORE

Treynor Schools Superintendent GARY FUNKHOUSER and School Board Member JERRY HEMPEL spoke about the plans for expanding the Elementary School. The number of students is increasing in the Treynor district, JERRY explained. The current enrollment is about 600 with 325 in the elementary school. JERRY showed a plan for expansion to accommodate three sections of each grade or an enrollment of 450 or more. Besides more class room space, JERRY noted, the expansion plans will add building features to enhance the library resources, vocal and instrument music programs, computer access, assembly space, and physical education. The plan, with an estimated cost is \$3.2 million, will also address additional security issues.

GARY explained financing could come from a couple of sources. Over a third could be paid by revenue bonds paid for by the current sales tax receipts. The remainder would be paid with general obligation bonds through property tax over a 14-yr period. However, GARY noted, the Treynor school district tax levy would still be lower than that for most other Pottawattamie school districts. GARY said a community meeting has been scheduled on Monday March 10 at the high school to discuss the plans with architects and construction manager representatives. There will an election for authorization of bonds to finance the project on March 25.
