#### **HOW HIGH CAN YOUR MULE JUMP?**

Bernard Bryant may not be a true 'mule skinner', but he certainly can tell you about being skinned by a mule. Bernard amused Club members about his 30+ years working with mulesbuying, trading, training, hunting, and vacationing with mules. It wasn't clear why Bernard began working with mules; it probably stems from his experiences growing up on a farm. Mules are a cross of a male donkey with female horse. Mules are known for their working ability and their sense of self-preservation that is more highly regarded than that for horses. Bernard described how mules could be trained to jump fences. A good jumper, Bernard noted, might clear a 60-inch fence, although the mule might be only a little over 50 inches tall at the shoulders. A practical reason for the mule to jump fences is so he can be ridden to hunt, and Bernard has had a lot of experience hunting raccoons at night with a mule and dogs. According to Bernard, mules never trust you, they just agree! There were a couple of times, Bernard noted, that he and his mule didn't get along-or agree.
