PRESERVING THE MEMORIES

The Carstens 1880 Farmstead, located near Shelby, Iowa, is a special place in Pottawattamie County that takes you back through the past century to experience the agrarian life of lowa's Charles Leaders, Mel Hursey, and Terry Torneten are board members of the Carstens 1880 Farmstead non-profit volunteer organization. Charles explained the farmstead is an 80-acre working farm exhibit with machinery, tools, and entire farmstead dating from the 1880s to the early 1900s. On the first weekend after Labor Day each year then have a special public event called Carstens Farm Days. The 21st Farm Days event will be held on September 6 and 7 this year. At the 20th anniversary Farm Days last year, Charles noted there were over 250 antique tractors, trucks, cars and other equipment pieces brought by owners to exhibit and demonstrate. The Carstens Farm Days grows each year with several thousand visitors. This year there will be a special recognition of Allis Chalmers tractors and equipment according to Charles. Mel stated the purpose of the memorial farmstead was to preserve and to educate. Each year hundreds of youth tour the farmstead to observe the methods of the past used to grow food and fodder. Terry noted volunteers can always find tasks to work on to keep the farmstead in good shape through the year.
