CONTROVERSIES KEEP POLITICIANS BUSY

State Representative Jack Drake, who has been serving in the legislature eleven years, spoke to Club members about some of the issues facing the Iowa legislature. Rep. Drake, a farmer from Lewis, IA, is chair of the Agriculture Committee. That committee is especially concerned about the effects of the Ethanol mandate on agricultural business, and the effects of regulatory rules for concentrated livestock facilities on smaller farm operations. Drake explained that the most challenging work for the legislature is finding a balance of regulation for environmental benefits without adverse economic effects. Drake noted the recent fiscal year for lowa ended better than expected, so some borrowed funds could be restored. He also noted that lowa was in better fiscal shape than most states. However, fewer funds are being allocated from the state to local governments. So part of the budget crunch is passed on to our communities.
