STRATCOM MISSIONS ARE GLOBAL

Major Terry McGovern spoke about the U.S. Strategic Command (STRATCOM) operations based at Offutt Air Base. McGovern explained there are currently five missions for STRATCOM. This is expanded from the original purposes when it was established a few years ago. The 1st mission is space operations, which includes navigation, intelligence, warning, weather, and communications. The 2nd mission is information operations, which includes psychological warfare through radio and TV broadcasts. The 3rd mission is called global strike. This includes coordination of sea, air, and ground equipment as well as computer security. The 4th mission is global integrated missile defense, which coordinates missile use on land, sea, and air. The 5th mission is command for intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance. This takes in all operations on land, sea, air, and cyberspace. McGovern emphasized STRATCOM facilitates a coordinated military response to global threats to the U.S. and provides a clear accountability of actions in response to orders from the President.
