THE FIRST 48 HOURS

Detective Larry Cahill of the Omaha Police Department spoke to Club members about investigating homicide cold case files. Larry has been in law enforcement for sixteen years, but the past couple years he has worked in homicide investigations. According to Larry there are about sixty cold case files ranging back nearly fifty years. These cases have no leads for officers to Larry noted that technical developments have investigate. provided opportunities to reopen case investigations. For example, he used ten-year-old DNA evidence to identify a suspect. However, Larry explained, most cases are solved within the first 48 hours when evidence and consequences of the crime are fresh.

WWII LIBERATOR

Attorney Richard "Dick" Peterson from Council Bluffs was part of one of the last Army Divisions sent to the European Front. Dick explained he enlisted in the Army Infantry in 1943 and in early 1945 he was on a boat headed for Germany. At this time the German military was retreating to various strongholds. Dick said he was involved in his first major battle with the German army on April 11, 1945 in Attendorn, Germany. After driving back the German resistance, his patrol entered the city and proceeded a sweep across town. Dick said they encountered a barb wire fenced section enclosing a great number of ragtag, dirty and hungry people. It turned out they had discovered a slave labor camp where Russian citizens had been enslaved to manufacture war materials. Dick said he was proud to have been a part of this unexpected liberation effort.
