POLITICAL LINKS TO OUR COMMUNITY

Iowa State Senator, Hubert Houser; Iowa State Representative candidate Greg Forristall; and US Senator Grassley's Western IA Regional Director, Donna Berry spoke to Club members about various issues at the state and national levels. Forristall is running for state representative office to replace Gerald Jones who stated he was retiring. Forristall stated he was most concerned about economic development and retention lowa university graduates to facilitate development. Berry explained she is the contact for Sen. Grassley for a 14 county region of western IA, and is located in Council Bluffs. She noted that Sen. Grassley plans to be in the area during the last two weeks of April. According to Houser, the primary issues of ongoing efforts relate to gambling, renewable fuels, eminent domain, child abuse, and appropriation increases.
