REPORT OF PREVIOUS CLUB MEETING

At the Club meeting on 4/8 there were 23 members and President GARY FUNKHOUSER one guests present. opened the meeting by leading the pledge. STEVE IRVIN led the devotional prayer.

Pres. FUNKHOUSER reported some actions of the recent Board meeting. Thirty dollars was given to Zion Church for use of the facility for the Zone meeting. Approximately \$200 will be given for additional books in support of the accelerated reading program at Treynor Schools. This includes associated software for testing and recording achievement of readers. Pres. FUNKHOUSER noted that the high school Octagon Club had also contributed \$150 toward this project.

FUNKHOUSER announced DAI F Pres. that WILLENBORG agreed to be Vice President and President Elect during the next Optimist year.

LES HARVEY announced the next can and bottle sorting with the Boy Scouts would be this coming Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. He also announced that the Club meeting on May 6 would be at the high school and he and MILLI would provide breakfast before the program on education technology led by Shelly Bailey.

STEVE IRVIN announced a meeting of the scholarship committee after the Club meeting.

Pres. FUNKHOUSER asked for volunteers to work at the track meet on April 17.

DICK BABER commented on progress of building a new Optimist club in Lamoni, IA. There are two individuals there very interested and see a need to mentor students in a major transition in the community. They just began the process of building a new high school on the site of the present school. During the next school year, high school classes will be conducted at Graceland College while the new building is being constructed.

Pres. FUNKHOUSER described a plan by District Governor Jim Boyd to have an Optimist booth at the Iowa State Fair. Members agreed to the \$30 cost to support the plan.

JOHN KLEIN announced that the Arbor Day tree planting project with the elementary school students will begin on Thursday the 20th with the digging of holes for seven trees. Then the trees will be planted the next day by students with our assistance.

JOHN KLEIN noted arrangements are complete for the Extension Service to provide leadership of the Baby-Sitting/Child Care Clinic this year. A NEWSPAPER IS A BUSINESS

Tom Schmitt is Chief Business Office and Editor of the Council Bluffs newspaper, 'The Nonpareil.' Schmitt spoke to Club members about the newspaper business and its unique relationship to its readers and community. There are three things that a newspaper does, Schmitt noted, 1) it reports news, 2) it mirrors the community, and 3) it reports history. The readership and community don't always think of the newspaper with these purposes. Schmitt noted that readers often complain that there is too much 'bad' news and not enough 'good' news. However, he noted that there is a lot of good news in the papers, but it is not discussed as much nor remembered. Schmitt noted that the internet has had more impact on the newspaper industry that radio, television, and cable TV. Nearly 40% of The Nonpareil readership is actually over the internet. Schmitt noted that The Nonpareil is 80% owned by the Omaha World Herald and during the five years he has been the news director there has been more local news printed.
