Treynor Schools

There was no designated speaker at the Optimist Club meeting on August 27. However, club members had a general discussion, led mainly by Steve Irvin.

The Treynor Fan website (<u>www.treynorfan.com</u>) is changing and will be hosted by ihigh.com in the future as www.ihigh.com/treynorfan. The new website is free while the old one was somewhat expensive. Jennifer Anderson is the contact for the website. They may continue to solicit donors for the website, but that will pay for equipment instead of website costs. The content should remain similar.

Enrollment at the Elementary school is up about 20 students. Total school enrollment contains about 25% open enrolled students.

This year a professor from IWCC is teaching Sociality at Treynor. 26 students are enrolled in the class. The High School offers 21 college credits. Two students are taking ecollege classes from IWCC.

Students are allowed to take up to 11 college credits per semester. More than that would be considered full time college and the schools is not obligated to pay for the tuition. However, parents continue to want the school to offer more college credits.

The ICN room at the High School is not used much. The equipment is old and needs to be updated.

Treynor requires all students to take a competency test for graduation. Other schools in the area do not require one. 98% of the seniors last year passed the first time they took the test.

There are 67 students out for marching band this year and 41 out for football. The senior class has 48 students and the largest class at Treynor is 66 students.

Iowa Straw Poll

Jeff Jorgensen talked at the Treynor Optimist Club on September 3 about the Iowa Straw Poll. It originally began in 1979 and was called the Ames Straw Poll. In 1999 the rules changed so that you had to be 16 ½ years old and an lowa resident or a student at one of the main three universities in Iowa. Before that many people from out of state were voting.

This year there were 30,000-40,000 people at the straw poll and 17,000 voted. Tickets are \$30, but most people sign up with a candidate and the candidate pays for their ticket. Indelible ink is used to prevent people from voting

The Iowa Straw Poll is a Republican event. It can give an early indication of how candidates are doing in their campaign. It is only held when the sitting president is not Republican or is not running for re-election. The winner of the straw poll is not often the winner of the caucus, and the winner of one or both of them is often not the party nominee. 1999 was the only time the winner of the straw poll, caucus, and Republican nominee for President was the same person.
