Community Design Program

The Iowa Architectural Foundation was formed in 1989 to promote awareness and appreciation of architecture and design in Iowa. It is now called the Community Design Program and focuses on making communities in Iowa more welcoming. More than 20 lowa communities have participated in the program. Iowa West Foundation provided a \$5000 grant to Treynor to help the city develop a plan for the future. The city has contributed an additional \$500.

The focus is Highway 92 from the East to the West end of Treynor. Community input is requested in a meeting February 27 at 6:30 p.m. at the Treynor Community Center. The goal is to complete the plan by April.

Treynor is a member of the lowa League of Cities and plans to join the Western Iowa Development Association in July. Both organizations help cities promote themselves.
