Vision Treynor

Travis Castle and Doug Wehring spoke at the Treynor Optimist Club meeting on March 12. They reviewed the origins of the Vision Treynor group and current plans.



Vision Treynor originally planned to get significant funding through lowa West Foundation (IWF). However, IWF has changed its focus and is no longer funding that type of project. They have purchased 63 acres and had a capital campaign. With an initial goal of raising \$20M, they have since revised their goal to raise \$3.2M. \$850,000 is needed to install the entry road, a gravel parking lot, complete grading and seeding of 24 acres, and create two full size soccer/multi-use fields and two baseball/softball diamonds.

Vision Treynor is talking to the City of Treynor to explore possible future roles of the city with respect to the complex.

Vision Treynor was also instrumental in reopening a fitness center in Treynor. They got a loan from TS Bank, purchased the fitness equipment, secured a lease agreement with the Pickle Barrel owners, and arranged for Jim and Courtney Lovely to operate the fitness center.
