Loess Hills Turf and Landscape

Keith Denton introduced speaker Bradley "Brad" Trede, Owner/Horticulturist of Loess Hills Turf and Landscape of Council Bluffs. Brad is a 2002 graduate of Treynor and a 2006 graduate of Northwest Missouri State University with a degree in horticulture. While in college Brad began working for Struyk Turf of Council Bluffs and continued there for 13 years. In April 2016 Brad started up his own landscaping business, Loess Hills Turf and Landscape.



Loess Hills Turf and Landscape provides landscaping, fertilization, weed control, aeration, seeding, pest control and more. Brad described the company's March through November turf program. In March and April a slow-release granular fertilizer is applied, which takes up to six weeks to break down. The slow, steady release of nitrogen provides healthy, manageable turf growth. Because weeds, such as dandelions, begin to set on at the end of March, a preemergent and weed control is applied with the fertilizer. emergent is any time before May 15. Insecticides for grub worm control are applied in June and July. Brad also does pest control spraying around homes. Aeration and seeding are recommended for either spring or fall. Trees and perennials used in landscaping projects are purchased from a wholesale company which helps keep costs down. In all applications and projects, Loess Hills Landscaping takes great care to protect the environment by following all label instructions.
