Hope Net is a non-profit, faith-based organization providing families and individuals in Council Bluffs with the tools and resources they need to break the cycles of addiction and poverty. The organization particularly ministers to women who are incarcerated and/or are drug-addicted and who wish to live crime free and drug free. A representative of Hope Net goes to the prison or jail to meet women and inform them of Aftercare which upon their release is available from Hope Net. Hope Net also goes to treatment facilities, halfway-houses, and three-quarter-way houses to meet women who may benefit from Hope Network Ministries. Hope Net focuses on helping the women build healthy relationships and helping them connect with other community nonprofits that can provide varied assistance as they reenter the community.
