## **Treynor Food Pantry**

Gary Funkhouser introduced speaker, Jnelle Keysor, Coordinator of the Treynor Food Pantry. Jnelle is a member of Zion Congregational Church and is retired as Treynor Community School District Food Service Director. Jnelle explained that the current Treynor Food Pantry originated 20 years ago at a meeting of Zion's Mission Board. The need for a food pantry was recognized and so with the community's support for food a Sunday School room was converted into a pantry; shelving units were installed and refrigerator and freezer obtained. In the beginning the Pantry would pack boxes and deliver. Now, the pantry has designated hours of operation; people come at that time and select for themselves what they need. Currently, seven families are using the pantry.



Jnelle commented on the bighearted giving from the community: a donor gives meat monthly; a financial donor provides monthly for produce and dairy; the Silver Creek 4-H Club helps with Thanksgiving and Christmas turkeys; the Junior Optimist Club (JOI) contributes money and sponsors a food drive; the Middle School Cardinal Pride groups provided a Christmas meal for each family; at Christmas the Optimists provided \$300 for gift cards; JOI provides money for gift cards as well; community women donate crocheted towels

and dishcloths; and of course all the other generous offerings of cash and food pantry items from the community. A community member has donated coats for a Coat Party at the pantry. The JOI Super Bowl Sunday food drive gathered a record 481 items and the Boy Scouts also sponsor a food drive each year. For birthday parties, some people have requested pantry items in place of gifts for themselves. The Treynor Food Pantry is fortunate to share back and forth with the Open Door Mission and Atlantic's Table of Mercy.

How can you donate to the pantry? The pantry is located in Zion church on Main Street in Treynor. The church is always open; staff for the children's care ministry is always there. Two boxes are located in the back hallway where donations can be left.

How can I use the pantry? To use the pantry, the hours of operation are the last Thursday of every month from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. There are no qualifications.
