Greg Forristall

Greg Forristall spoke at the Treynor Optimist Club on February 11. Greg is serving his sixth term in

the Iowa House of Representatives.

Greg and his wife Carol live in rural Macedonia. She has taught music in Iowa public schools for 35 years.

Greg serves on the Education committee as the Vice Chairman. He also serves on the Labor, Human Resources, and Ways and Means

committees in the Iowa house.

Greg said the current legislative session started on January 11. They are currently working on budget cuts, since the September revenue estimate came in lower than expected. The Iowa Constitution says the State must balance its budget. The state gets spring and fall budget estimates and the September estimate requires a \$117M cut in the state expenses.

Governor Branstad has been nominated to be the U.S. Ambassador to China. He will need to have 100 people assist him in his new assignment. When Branstad is confirmed Kim Reynolds, the Lt Governor, will become Governor. She will pick a new Lt. Governor.

Greg said that water quality is a major issue in Iowa. To improve water quality, the state will have to do some type of cost sharing with farmers. Kirk Vorthmann said that the use of dual purpose fertilizers, anhydrous and fertilizer applied about six inches deep, should help reduce runoff.

Greg said that the Republicans took control of the House in 2010 and gained the Senate in 2016.

The House is working closely with the Senate to get work done.

The state has very little money to with, so they will probably have no new programs. The low price of corn and soybeans has caused much of the State funding shortage.

Every five years the legislature reviews tax credits. The largest tax credits are for earned income credit and no tax on food. Greg doesn't expect the Legislature to change those tax credits.

The Medicaid budget is a required Federal program, so the State cannot change much there. The State spends about \$1.7B each year on Medicaid.
