## Tim Navara Speaks to Optimists

Tim Navara, Treynor Activities Director, spoke to the Treynor Optimists on Saturday, April 7. The position has evolved from coordinating the Athletics activities as well as the Arts.

A University of Iowa graduate, Navara's job description includes: directing, supervising and coordination of activities, managing the budget, serving as liaison for scheduling all schools within WIC, serving as liaison to the State Athletic Association and Union, hosting state events, supervising coaches and watching practices, providing guidance and direction with facilities and keeping an eye out for potential new hires.

The West Gym will soon have new red bleachers after 35 years. The life of the old bleachers exceeded expectations due to great custodial care.

Gate sales and athletic passes fund sports activities. Football and basketball sales are in the black and support the other activities as well as helping fund participation costs in state events.

The Treynor Athletic Booster Club Bash on April 27 is a great effort to raise funds to support a budget for each coach plus a large fund to help the school with larger expenses. New wall mats are needed for the gym.

Navara stated that he puts in for every state event. The sponsoring school receives $20 \%$ of the admissions gate. He gave great praise to School Secretary Danette Blackledge who assists him and lines up workers.
He grooms the artificial turf, which has a life of ten years, every other week. It is composed of ground up old tires. He uses a tined wheel to turn up debris and a fork-type machine to fluff the turf.
Navara discovered recently a Council Bluffs Official Assigner who will arrange all officials for all levels of football and basketball for an annual fee of $\$ 300$ which is well worth it. More crews are three man because officials are getting older. There is a need for younger officials. Officiating two games of basketball will pay $\$ 100$ each and \$160 for soccer.

There is also an increased need for activity bus drivers especially in the spring. If you have a CDL, contact Navara. On Thursday alone five buses and two vans were needed to haul athletes.

In addition, Navara coordinates the Endeavor Program for At Risk students. There are currently five kids who focus on one course at a time. One current student will graduate early with an A minus average. Kids come to school from 9-12 and go to a job at 1:00.
