Gary Guttau Speaks about Docent Training

Gary Guttau spoke about his docent training at the Henry Doorly Zoo to the Treynor Optimist Club on Saturday, May 12. A docent educates the public about the animals and areas of the Zoo. As a former science and vocational agriculture teacher, he enjoys learning and it's a great fit for him. Once a week on Thursdays he trains at the Zoo from 8:30 AM - 12 PM. Much of the training is with official docents in very small groups and in the various areas of the Zoo. He can train in as many areas as he wants. There will be tests to take before becoming an official docent.

Interesting facts learned are: The Zoo has existed since 1894 and the Lied Jungle has been open for 26 years. In the Lied Jungle each pond has its own water control underneath. Hippos relieve themselves in the water so filtering is a problem. There is a new baby hippo.

The new educational building provides 12 grades of school offering kids from different districts in

the metro area the opportunity to apply if interested. Next year kids from Glenwood, IA will be able to apply.

Under the aquarium there are work places to raise jelly fish, etc for food. He has been able to walk over the aquarium also. Volunteer scuba divers clean the aquarium.

He has been able to pet a rhinoceros. Their mouths reach out for lettuce much like an elephant.

Gary stated the Omaha Zoo's Wildlife Safari near Ashton is in need of hayracks.

He stated there are very dedicated volunteers and workers who don't like to take vacation because they know the animals are attached to them.
