Travis Castle Speaks about Vision Treynor

Travis Castle spoke to the Treynor Optimists on July 7 about Vision Treynor Group. Castle owns American Family Insurance - Travis Castle Agency, Inc. with offices in Bellevue, Treynor, Nebraska City, and Council Bluffs. Castle also works as an Assistant Basketball Coach for the Treynor Boys Basketball program.

Travis' leadership with Vision Treynor Group, founded in 2010, is as a community volunteer along with other community volunteers who have devoted their time to planning. Doug Wehring, Vision Treynor Treasurer, attended also. The mission statement is to promote public projects that improve Treynor.

TS Bank gave \$500,000 to help buy the 63 acres located in the center of town and close to the school which is the current center of activity in Treynor. A later gift of \$100,000 was also given by TS Bank. Vision Treynor has also received donations from individuals, families, and community groups.

An early survey of the community showed four desires: 1) a pool, 2) Little League fields, 3) a walking trail, and 4) a fitness center. 
community by encouraging housing, and to be a gathering place.

Vision Treynor helped locate the exercise-fitness center in its current location. Vision Treynor owns the building and equipment. The Lovely family run the facility in shared governance. It is selfsustaining. No Vision Treynor funds were used to achieve this goal.

The focus now is to get people out on the site. This summer 12-15 acres of the total 63 acres will be made grade ready and in time to plant grass this fall. All current grading will not require having any dirt hauled in, just moved around. This space will allow enough room for a soccer field and a softball field. There will be a crushed rock road and parking area. The cost of this Phase One is \$420,000. Watch for update coverage in the Nonpareil about the project.

Each phase will be done one at a time and will always be done to grade to fit the overall plan. Part of the land at the very north will be offered for sale for someone wanting to make it a housing development. This will free up money to develop the overall plan. Another plan to raise funds is to offer the right to name one of the fields. Castle expressed thanks to the Clausen family for farming the land and maintaining the property.

Vision Treynor is open to any amenities or projects that anyone wants to present for use of the land.
