# Julie Buckelew Speaks about Cardiac Care

Julie Buckelew spoke to the Treynor Optimists on July 14 about Cardiac Care. Julie graduated from Jennie Edmundson in 1986. After working as an orthopedic nurse, as a floater, and intensive care nurse, she found her passion as a cardiac catheter lab- chest pain coordinator. Julie is married to Dan Buckelew and lives near Treynor. They have two adult sons.

A Helmsley Grant has allowed The Mission Life Line to begin in North Dakota and now is benefiting nine states, including Iowa. The mission is that every person gets the same cardiac care when exhibiting chest pain. All health care facilities in Iowa, including EMS departments, agree on the same procedures. Care in Walnut is the same as in Davenport. The most recent research is shared to get the same treatment. Julie coordinates this effort and training. This is done through conference calls, meeting in person, and an advisory committee.

She described chest pain protocol. Aspirin is given immediately (comparable to four baby or two regular aspirins – chewing is preferable). A determination needs to be made if it is really NEWSLETTER www.treynoroptimist.org Treynor Optimist Club President: Keith Denton

chest pain or lungs, etc. Blood work and an EKG are done within ten minutes and then read in ten minutes. The score determines if the patient is treated immediately or can wait. From entering the door to balloon time, a patient is to be treated in 60 minutes or less. The current average at Jennie Edmundson is 30+minutes. The standardization allows a patient coming from another facility to skip the Emergency Department.

Buckelew discussed the importance of calling 911 if experiencing chest pain. Having someone drive you can add 30 more minutes to the process. EMS care has improved greatly. All care providers are in agreement to take the patient to the nearest hospital. All patients can go back to their own community for their primary care and cardiac rehab. If a bypass, etc. is needed, the patient will be transferred to the hospital of their choice. The whole program emphasizes training and commitment to do what is best for the patient.

Other topics discussed were new types of stints, sleep apnea, lifestyle, stress heart attacks, and transplants.
