Jeannette Blackstone Speaks about Dementia

Jeannette Blackstone spoke to the Treynor Optimists on July 21 about Dementia. Jeannette is the Executive Director of Country House Residence, serving people with memory loss, located on 1831 East Kanesville Blvd in Council Bluffs, near Primrose.

She stated that there are many reasons for memory loss, ranging from vascular disease, carbon monoxide poisoning, to Parkinson's. It is not just an age disease.

Blackstone listed ten signs of dementia:

- Disruption in everyday life. The person doesn't do their normal activities any more. When asked why, they state they don't feel well or don't remember. They can hide it well.
- Challenges in solving/planning problems such as making a recipe or can't remember periodically how to use a tool.
- 3) Difficulty in completing a familiar task.
- 4) Confusion of time and place.

- 5) Understanding visual images. They may see someone following you or see something that isn't there.
- 6) Problems in speaking and writing.
- 7) Misplace stuff, which we all do, but they are unable to retrace steps.
- Decrease in or poor judgment. They may want to donate to any person who calls about a cause.
- 9) Withdraw from work and social activity.
- 10)Changes in mood and personality. They can make you feel guilty and convince others they aren't being treated well.

Remember "Dementia has you, not you have dementia. Dementia has control." The patient does things that aren't normal and can't help themselves. It is a "moment by moment" disease. Alzheimer's is one type of dementia. The younger you are in getting dementia, the faster it progresses. Research is being done on meds to help.

Country House provides managed care, programming specific to the dementia. In learning the patient's life story, they try to provide activities suitable to the person – baking, painting, bus trips daily. Bingo and pie on Wednesday at Village Inn are musts. Families are encouraged to visit and take residents out to eat, etc. They also provide for home care providers - Day Stay for 4-8 hrs for non-residents as well as respite care for up to 30 days. On the 4th Thursdays, they provide a caregivers support group lunch.

One interesting tip was a urinary tract infection (UTI) after a certain age can cause confusion so it's important to check that out.
