Tom Becka Speaks

Tom Becka, Fox 42 KPTM-TV News Commentator, spoke to the Treynor Optimist Club on April 6, 2019 at the Treynor Community Building. Becka stated that he is hired by the Simpsons Fox, not the Hannity Fox. He is allowed to say what he wants. He prepares and airs daily six days a week; however, he produces Sunday night's show on Friday. Becka's Beat airs at approximately 9:15 PM.

A reflection of the world today is the recent sign under the TV at HyVee in Omaha where Becka and his buddies drink coffee in the morning, stating "No news on TV". Several news programs were constantly running and clients were getting riled, but no more. Instead, HyVee is running sports programs. He said the news is stressful today and people are shutting it off, but he said we must still pay attention. There is danger in not following news. He stated that 40 percent of Americans don't have access to local news. He also stated that Facebook is doing a study to add more local news.

Becka stated that snap judgments are made today on social media, and we must be aware how we consume social media and be smart in using social media. It is important that we all make opinions based on fact, not emotions, he opined.

Becka also stated that Americans aren't as divided as the media makes us think. The Midwest floods are an example. It doesn't matter if First Responders, other volunteers are Republican, Democrat, or any other group that separates beliefs when we are working for a common cause, and Becka stated that needs to be emphasized more. He also said that groups like ours (Optimist Club) get along regardless of beliefs. That must be embraced more.

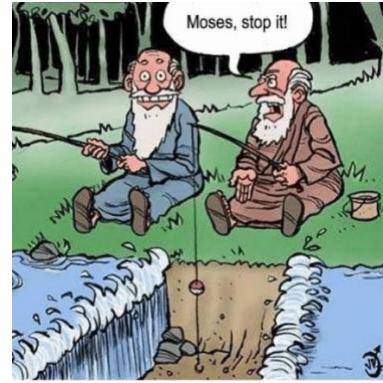
