Nonpareil Sports Writer, Kevin White Speaks

Kevin White, SWI Sports Writer for the Nonpareil and World Herald, spoke to the Treynor Optimist Club on April 20, 2019 at the Treynor Community Building. White is a well-known figure in SW Iowa. He was a 1986 Tri-Center grad and his dad, T Gary White was AD there.

Kevin got his start in writing from Mike Condon, sports writer for the Nonpareil, when he asked Kevin to write a diary of his experiences while at a state high school event which was published. He then worked at the Nonpareil while in college and upon graduation worked in the news room writing baby announcements and obituaries, knowing that a sports writer position would be available soon.

From 1991 to 2000, he was a sports writer for the Nonpareil and then became the Western Iowa sports writer for the World Herald until 2009. He then had the position he currently has, and at that time he was manager over 3 full-time employees and 3-4 part-time employees.

The World Herald was the largest independent newspaper in the country, but that is no longer true as it has merged with Lee Enterprises, Davenport. Cost cutting while trying to offer quality is the norm. Now his job has been cut to just him and one support person. The future of journalism is changing due to social media and online availability.

White's job is challenging to cover in the spring because of the large variety of sports - high school track, golf, soccer, tennis and college baseball and softball. He said it takes him 4-5 hours to compile the list of girls/boys track records, but technology has reduced that time greatly. He also stated that info now has to be submitted by 11:15, rather than 1 am, which can be challenging.

Because of the dismissal of the St. Albert basketball coach, Kevin enjoyed helping with coaching the freshmen this year at St. Alberts and assisting also with varsity. He keeps in shape by playing pick-up ball at the Y over the noon hour.

Additional discussion included Kevin's thoughts on Treynor's decision not to join the Hawkeye 10, changes in the size of the sports page, the time and decision to write on Twitter, and info on his family. He is hopeful to start a "Live Like Jill" Camp in honor of his wife who died 8 months ago. He also updated the group on his daughter, Bailey, a Senior and Carter, a Freshman, as well as his parents.
