Paige Volkens Speaks

Paige Volkens, Education Director for East & West Pott. Soil and Water Conservation District, spoke to the Treynor Optimist Club on April 27, 2019 at the Treynor Community Building. Paige, a Treynor native, received her BS from NW Missouri State in Ag Science with a minor in Ag Communications.



Paige's job is unique! This is the only District in Iowa with an Education Director.

The job entails educating pre-K to Adults, outreach, public relations, and leading and building existing programs and creating new programs. West Pott, which had never had an Education Director, was added to her job description when she started in Nov.

Examples of programs for youth which Volkens is involved with includes: Farm tours, summer camps, after school programs, Quarry Days, field days, Farm Safety Days, FFA programs and more. A recent fun experience on Earth Day was for school kids to draw pictures on grocery bags which the grocery store then used with customers. Other programs include Rain Gardens, a Rain Barrel Workshop, and the Iowa Children's Water Festival.

The Botna Bend Field Days, due to flooding, will take place at WestFair this year and topics will be about birds, trees, bees, snakes, and a rain fall simulator. Volkens told about a Soil to Spoon after school cooking club and a conservation Superhero Club.

A specific program for women is the Women Landowner Summer 2019 event on Sat., June 15 from 8:30 AM – 11 AM at the Oakland Community Center. Topics to be taught include farm business estate planning and retirement by TS Prosperity Group and Sara Ross discussing making food and farming personal.

August 10 is the Rural Ramble, Pott Co. Small Farm Tour, which runs similar to a Poker Run and will feature Ditmar's Orchard, The Swallows Nest, Prairie Crossing Winery, Give Joy Gardens, Minden Meat Market/ Hodges Smokehouse Catering, Cedar Valley Ranch, AgriVision Equipment, Iowa Corn, Pott Co. Paige is now the only woman (and youngest) member of the W. Pott Farm Bureau Board. She is President of the Pott Co. Iowa Corn and SoyBean Growers and she serves on the SW Iowa Women's Land & Legacy Committee.

Old Business: The Scholarship Committee announced they had selected their scholarship recipients.


