# **Phil Waggoner Shares**

Phil Waggoner spoke to the Treynor Optimist Club on June 1, 2019 at Zion Congregational Church. He shared his testimony and mission work with children.



Phil moved to Treynor 45 years ago. His family moved often while he grew up and he didn't like school. His mom was an optimist and was confident and hopeful about the future. His mom took the kids to church. At age 12 a picture at church of

Jesus with a staff, a lamb and a child made him feel he needed to be a preacher. However, from age 15-34, he chose not to go to church. He felt Jesus loved him, but still he felt unworthy, which was built into him as a kid.

As an adult Phil tried farming and then was a hired man in Malvern for Gordon and Mable Axtel. Through them, he eventually became a believer. He met Mike Kalstrup and Jeff Danker and he fell in love with Treynor and his future wife Jan, who he has been married to for 42 years.

Phil felt led to do something for kids. He learned to use fast moving puppets and attended training at Tulsa, OK. He became an ordained and licensed pastor. He served as the Children's Ministry Pastor for many years at Fellowship Church. He has been involved in mission work in India, West Africa, and Haiti and shared the frustrations and opportunities to minister in those areas.

Phil is Vice Chairman of the SW lowa Child Evangelism Fellowship Board and shared information about the work being done to develop Good News Clubs in the area schools and 5 day summer clubs in communities for boys and girls. More volunteers are needed to help with these clubs.

Phil is a school bus driver for the Treynor Community Schools and considers it a ministry to get to know and relate to the children who ride his bus on his regular route as well as for special sports and activity trips. Driving a bus is a big responsibility and he is very careful to check all of the mirrors checking for the kids' safety getting on and departing the bus. A big concern is people who run bus lights at four of his stops on Highway 6.

Waggoner stated that in the world and even locally there are kids who do not know who Jesus is. He has a heart for children and sharing Jesus and hope with children.

ISU will present recommendations from the study that took place with citizens this winter at a meeting this Wed, June 12 from 4-7 PM at the Treynor Community Building.


