Pott Co. Trails Program

Courtney Harter spoke to the Treynor Optimist Club on June 8, 2019 at the Treynor Community Building. Courtney lives in Oakland, but was born in Council Bluffs. She is the President of the Pottawattamie County Trails Association and also is Community Project Development Coordinator for Council Bluffs.

The Pott County Trails Association was established in



2012 and Courtney has been involved since 2013. The group would love to have representation from Treynor. It is a grassroots, volunteer organization with the mission to promote health and prosperity for future generations through the establishment of a county-wide trail network connecting all cities within Pott Co. and additional connections to adjacent trail systems.

The Association is a fundraising body to assist Pott Co. Conservation with construction of trails and creation of an endowment fund for long-term trail maintenance. It has many phases and will take many, many years to complete.

In 2017, construction began on Phase I of the Council Bluffs to Neola segment starting at the Smith Wildlife Area on Railroad Highway. The 1.8 miles section was completed in 2018.

In 2019, Conservation bid the Phase II of the segment which includes a one mile segment and two bridges over the Mosquito Creek. An additional feature will be the trails first art installation by a local artist.

To date, \$4 million in funding for the CB to Neola segment has been received. \$2 million came from Iowa West Foundation, \$1.4 million from Iowa DOT, and \$425,000 from MAPA. An additional \$2 million is needed to complete the extension.

The Association has two ongoing fundraising events which includes the Arrowhead Obstacle Course Run and BIKEtober in the Bluffs. The goal is raise a large endowment to sustain maintenance of the trails.

ArtFITS was formed to further the goal of trail art. "Goldfinch Gates" which is three dimensional will be installed on each side of one of the bridges to Neola.



The next phase is to secure land along the connection from Hancock to Oakland. This segment was chosen because of the abandoned railroad right-of-way available and ease of terrain.

Old Business:


