## Arlyn Norris Speaks to Optimists

Arlyn Norris spoke to the Treynor Optimist Club on July 6, 2019 at the Treynor Community Building. Pastor Norris retired in 2014 after serving at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Treynor. A former member of the Treynor Optimist Club, Arlyn updated the group on his life and read from memoirs he is writing.



Since retiring Pastor Norris' most recent mission trip was to Chile. He is affiliated with the Companion Synod Group. Over many years he has been on mission trips to Chile twice and Tanzania five times.

Arlyn reflected on the experiences he and his wife Wanda have had with her cancer since a lump was first found years ago. Treatment had been effective more than once and then a lump was found which would change their lives. Cancer had spread to her liver and then to the brain. Treatment helped at first, but then it was imminent that hospice care was needed. In those remaining weeks she was able to enjoy visits with her sisters, family, and one rainy Sunday was able to attend church in Treynor and see church family and friends. She also had visits from friends in AZ and from past parishes where they had served. She passed May 20, 2016 in Tucson.

Arlyn is passionate about writing and retired to care for his wife and to pursue writing. He has journaled for years and has attended writing clinics and festivals. He has almost completed his memoirs of his experiences and hopes to get a book published. His

memoirs are written in three parts: 1) care, 2) grief, 3) new life. Those attending today were moved by his style: the detail, the searching, the inspiration, and deep feelings expressed as Arlyn read excerpts from his memoirs.

In November, 2018, Pastor Norris married a lady, named Pilair, who is originally from Mexico. She has her BA in finance and economics and has a Masters in Spanish Education. She teaches Spanish at Pima College in Tucson, where they live. They each have three grown children. She visited Iowa for the first time this year.
