Marlys Lein Speaks about the Library

Marlyns Lein, Adult Program Librarian at the Council Bluffs Public Library, spoke to the Treynor Optimists on October 26, 2019. Lein was born in Minnesota, is married and has lived in Iowa for twelve years. She and Bill Vorthmann sing in the same church choir.



Lein taught about websites and web pages. Everything offered is free and can be borrowed. A library card offers you access to books, audio books, E-books, music, DVDs, Makerspace, cake pans, art to decorate your home or office, and databases of information on: medical and legal aid, auto repair, employment,

local history and more.

E-books can be checked out for two weeks and movies, TV shows, music, and magazines can be checked out for one week.

A summary of special services for digital use was presented:

Hoopla allows you to borrow movies, etc. to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone. OverDrive also allows you to enjoy free eBooks and more. Bring your device to the library and you will be assisted with set-up.

rbDigital allows you to browse thousands of digital audiobooks and download to your device. RB Digital Magazines is the world's largest digital library newsstand. There is no limit to the number you can download.

Linked in Learning combines Lynda's video courses with LinkedIn insights to give personalized learning which will help you learn or improve on skills in business, photography, design, software or web development. This can be used in the library only.

referenceUSA is a business database which is ideal for identifying sales leads, mailing lists, doing market research and more. After the meeting, John Klein reports he created a 2019 Treynor Phone Book using

this online option, that lists virtually every adult in Treynor whether they have a phone or not.

MakerSpace allows you to convert VHS, 8 mm movies to a thumb drive, scan books and photos, digitize records and tapes, do 3D printing and modeling, utilize recording studio services, and professionally edit software.
