Doug Dillivan from the Iowa Farm Business Association, spoke at the Treynor Optimist Club on Saturday, July 11. He is from Adel, Iowa. He got his BS in Accounting from Buena Vista College and is also a CPA. His mother was also a CPA.



Doug worked in Fairfield, lowa for a small accounting firm. He also worked for Casey's for four years and helped bring their accounting in-house. In 2000 he worked for one of the largest accounting firms in the country. He also worked for Woodman Life.

In November 2018, Doug started working in Treynor for the Iowa Farm Business Association, a non-profit organized by farmers. They have six divisions in Iowa and 22 consultants. They are not connected with any university.
