Treynor Splash Pad

Wendy Andersen and Brooke Curtis came to talk about the Treynor Splash Pad. They started working on it four years ago and it is finally going



to become a reality. They are in the process of purchasing one acre of land from Treynor Vision. The splash pad itself will include controls for water flow and time available.

Wendy said the total project is about \$300,000 and they have raised \$68,100. They expect to start construction in the spring with availability in early summer 2022. The splash pad will cost about \$120,000, the shelter and tables \$40,000, and the changing room and bathroom \$50,000. A play area will be part of phase 2 the next year.

Mike Holton also talked about the project. The city will get \$143,000 from ARPA (Covid relief). They have half of that money already, to be used for sewer and water for the Treynor Vision/Splash pad area. The county gets \$25M for Covid relief and is very tight with that money. Treynor has asked for \$1M for roads in the Treynor Vision/Splash Pad area. He said they presented a good case to the county.

Mike said the splash pad could use as much as 150,000 gallons a day on a very hot day. The water cannot be recycled in Iowa, but they hope to use it for watering the soccer/baseball fields. The soccer fields use 56,000 gallons for watering.

Mike Holton talked a little about Treynor. He said the census shows Treynor has 1032 people, not including the newest edition. That is a 12% increase from 2010.

The Dollar General store will be coming to Treynor. They bought land and will build a 10,460 sq. ft. store and will have 39 parking stalls when completed. They will probably break ground in November.

Next week's speaker will be Kelsey Stupfell, TS Bank, discussing REV and her role as Director of Public Relations at TSBG.
