Jeff Casey, Treynor HS Football Coach



Jeff Casey, Treynor High School Football Coach, spoke today to the Optimists about the 2021 football season. The team went 6-2 and qualified for the playoffs.

Casey loves stats and stated that this was the 50th anniversary for the Playoffs and Treynor has qualified

twenty of those years. Only two schools in the KMA coverage area have been there more – Harlan and St Albert. He also stated this year's seniors were on teams that qualified three out of four years.

Next year a lot of work will need to be done to keep it rolling as 16 senior players are graduating. Those seniors have won 75% of their games in their four years.

Casey stated that tomorrow (Sunday) is a time to celebrate the kids at the football banquet, and there will be many award winners named. District awards will be named soon as well. Eleven players are receiving district recognition and eleven have made the academic team.

Coach announced that **Thomas Schwartz**, kicker, is being heavily recruited by several colleges. Thomas has also been invited to play in the River Bowl. The top 50 high school players in both Iowa and Nebraska will play in that bowl game the Saturday after Thanksgiving.

Coach Casey gave an update on kids he coached that went on to play in college. **Austin Kulesa** played as linebacker at IWCC and is now an assistant coach at Treynor and is on the Treynor Fire Dept. **Jake Fisher** went to the University of Iowa but had a 2" tear in his shoulder while in high school, which kept him out of the fall practice at Iowa. During spring ball he tore his other shoulder. He is a pre-med student and is paused with football for right now. **Brock Fox** is having a great time at Augustana at Sioux Falls, SD, is an art major and a guard. He has two seniors ahead of him, is red shirted, and has

great coaches and lots of opportunity. His strength and conditioning coach is former Treynor player, **Brett Chambers**. **Jack Tiarks** is doing well at ISU. He was red shirted and is back to being a linebacker, the same spot as Michael Rose. An injury caused him to be out for a month. He grew up as a Husker fan, but loves it at ISU. **Blake Sadr** went to ND State and on the second day he injured his shoulder and could not practice. He made the decision to transfer to IWCC and future plans are to go to the University of Iowa as a student.

Coach Casey said he is very, very picky about the men who are on his coaching staff. They are all really good men that he would want his own kids to be coached by. **Steve Chambers** has had a total of approximately 50 years' experience and is in his 25th year at Treynor. Other coaches are: **Josh Weiss, Joe Chapman, Seth Christensen, Jon Schnepel, TJ Quick and Austin Kulesa.**

A thrill for Coach Casey was the last home game when 133 youth football players filed on to the field and formed the tunnel. He also loves seeing more youth now playing backyard football. He's also excited that Fellowship of Christian Athletes is off to a good start.
